- CDM 2015 requires any Designer appointed to a project to have the skills, knowledge and experience to fulfil the role they have been appointed to undertake. By completing this questionnaire you will be able to review the competence of designers.
- 2) Although Part A of the questionnaire is marked, the focus of the questionnaire is to establish Training needs in order to achieve and maintain an individual's competence.
- 3) Part B of the questionnaire is not marked as this depends on the practices of your employer and those your employer works for. However, those practices may leave you short of desirable experience, which this questionnaire seeks to identify so that training may be devised to address the deficit.

7. List five duties of the client on all projects

#### Possible answers are:

- 1. Make suitable arrangements for managing a project, including the allocation of sufficient time and other resources.
- 2. Arrangements are suitable if they ensure that—
  - (a) the construction work can be carried out, so far as is reasonably practicable, without risks to the health or safety of any person affected by the project; and
  - (b) the minimum welfare facilities required by Schedule 2 are provided in respect of any person carrying out construction work.
- 3. Ensure that these arrangements are maintained and reviewed throughout the project.
- 4. Provide pre-construction information as soon as is practicable to every designer and contractor appointed, or being considered for appointment, to the project.
- 5. Ensure that—
  - (a) before the construction phase begins, a construction phase plan is drawn up by the contractor if there is only one contractor, or by the principal contractor; and
  - (b) the principal designer prepares a health and safety file for the project, which—
    - (i) complies with the requirements of regulation 12(5);
    - (ii) is revised from time to time as appropriate to incorporate any relevant new information; and
    - (iii) is kept available for inspection by any person who may need it to comply with the relevant legal requirements.
- 6. A client must take reasonable steps to ensure that the principal designer and the principal contractor comply with their duties.
- 7. If the Client disposes of it's interest in a structure, they must provide the health and safety file to the person who acquires the structure.



- 8. Where there is more than one contractor, or if it is reasonably foreseeable that more than one contractor will be working on a project at any time, the client must appoint in writing—

  (a) a designer with control over the pre-construction phase as principal designer; and
  (b) a contractor as principal contractor.
- 9. The appointments must be made as soon as is practicable, and in any event, before the construction phase begins.
- 10. If the client fails to appoint a principal designer or principal contractor, the client must fulfil the duties himself.
- 11. Where a project is notifiable, the client must give notice in writing to the HSE as soon as is practicable before the construction phase begins.


